- 1. Google Earth HR. It lets you explore any location on the planet. It comes with an added bonus of a bird's eye view.
- 2. NASA's Mars 2030. Created in collaboration with NASA, it lets you breathe in panoramic views of the Martian surface. You can wonder around the landscape, gaze at Martian skies, drive a rover and even plant a flag.
- 3. Boulevard brings to you collections from museums and art galleries from around the world. It's currently free and the company encourages teachers to use it as an educational tool in the classroom.
- 4. Everest VR allows you to experience all the stages of a climbing expedition from the preparation stage, to traversing through the Khumbu Icefall to finally reaching the peak where you can activate the God mode that gives you a unique vantage point of the Himalayas.
